The team of Woerth/Paul jiggged their way to a 15.36 lb victory with the only over 28 inch fish weighed in the tournament, a 9.63lb behemoth biting on to James Paul's jig with 10 minutes left in the tournament. The 2nd place team of Schroder/Jackson and 3rd place team of Debric/Miller were trolling crankbaits for their fish.

Congratulations to all the teams finishing in the top 9 as they were in the money.
